**Re: Revisions to Senate Bylaw 182**

The CNAS Executive Committee, at their April 14th meeting, reviewed the Revisions to Senate Bylaw 182: University Committee on International Education and has some concerns. Please see the concerns below:

- (1) The proposed Bylaw 182 International Education, originally from Bylaw 165 Education Abroad Program, includes now both international education and research. The title of the proposed Bylaw 182 (education only), however, does not properly reflect its content. Furthermore, the proposed policy coverage on international research is too broad. In item 2.i and 2.ii, it is not clear in what capacity and in what scope UCIE determines the international research collaborations at the individual level.
- (2) The name of UCIE (education only) does not properly reflect the proposed expanded responsibilities, which go much beyond international education.
- (3) There are several local committees on various campuses, with the similar responsibility in international education. It is necessary to clarify the roles of UCIE and the various local committees on international education.
