<p><b>SOBA4.2.1</b> The members of the School of Business Administration academic programs committees will be appointed by the Executive Committee and shall have representation in all academic areas as defined in 4.1.1. The Dean of the School of Business Administration will be an ex officio member <del>of the committees</del>. In addition, the Executive Committee can appoint other non-voting members to the committees as needed.</p>	<p><b>SOBA4.2.1</b> The members of the School of Business Administration academic programs committees will be appointed by the Executive Committee and shall have representation in all academic areas as defined in 4.1.1. The Dean of the School of Business Administration will be an ex officio member <u>and the Associate Dean(s) of the School will be non-voting ex officio member(s)</u>. In addition, the Executive Committee can appoint other non-voting members to the committees as needed.</p>
<p><b>Justification:</b> One of the duties of the Associate Dean(s) is to provide overall supervision and administration of undergraduate and graduate programs in the School. Hence, it makes sense for the Associate Dean(s) to be member(s) of the academic programs committees</p>
